

In Memorium

Tom Roby (*deceased December 31, 2022*) published and performed his poetry in a variety of venues in Chicago, while leading workshops, writing criticism, and winning various competitions. He created The Poetry Wheel, a non-competitive alternative to poetry slams, in which each poet must read in relation to the previous one and state the connection, so that the poets would improvise their selections as the performance wended its way through unplanned creative waters. He was President and critique leader of the Poets' Club of Chicago,

and chairperson of their annual sonnet contest. Smoke and Mirror Productions selected his poems about the adventures of

George and Judy with Grin Reaper for performances at the Loop Theater in April 2004. Tom was ChicagoPoetry.com's Poet of the Month for National Poetry Month, April 2006. A member of the National Association for Poetry Therapy, he made presentations based on his chapbook, *Griever's Circuit* (Fractal Edge Press, 2004), poems on the death of his wife, Mary. He and his multi-instrumentalist son, Lem, comprised Omniphonic, a duo that performed "The Sounds of Poems, the Poetry of Sound."

Marianne Tefft is a poet and voiceover reader who daylights as a Montessori teacher on the Dutch Caribbean island of Saint Maarten. Her poems and short stories appear online and in print in anthologies and journals in North America, Europe, Asia and the Caribbean. She is the author of the 2022 poetry collections Full Moon Fire: Spoken Songs of Love and Moonchild: Poems for Moon Lovers.

Wilda Morris is past president of both the Illinois State Poetry Society and Poets & Patrons of Chicago. She is the author of three full-length poetry books: Szchewan Shrimp and Fortune Cookies: Poems from a Chinese Restaurant, Pequod Poems: Gamming with Moby-Dick, and At Goat Hollow and Other Poems.

The Brewed Awakening reading on Sunday, **August 27**, will feature **Jared Smith**, a former member of ISPS who now lives in Maryland, on Zoom, and local poet **Laurel Poe Gallagher**, in person.

Jared Smith's 16th book of poetry, A Sphere Encased in Fires and Life, has just been released by New York Quarterly. A former member of ISPS and Chicago Poets Club, he is a poetry editor of Turtle Island Quarterly. His work has appeared in hundreds of publications and anthologies in this country and abroad. Jared now lives in Maryland with his wife.

Laurel Poe Gallagher is a storyteller who has presented her original stories at venues, including *Do Not Submit*, *This Much Is True, Green Man Theater* and the Chicago Public Library. This is Laurel's first public reading of original poetry. She is deeply grateful for the opportunity to share her verses with the Illinois State Poetry Society.



It was a challenging and fun project for high school students, and it increases the visibility/education of the art of haiku for young people.
